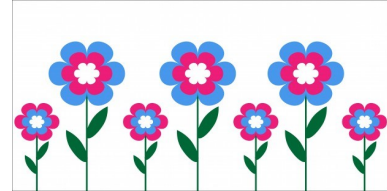
Please remember to bring a lunch to all Non-school days and a disposable bag lunch for field trip days.



Fun Tips for Bancroft Families

Spring weather can be tricky to plan for especially in Minnesota!

Outdoor Play: Children will spend time outside every day, weather permitting. Children should dress properly for active play. Extra clothing on cold days (i.e. hats, mittens, and warm coats) as well as boots when necessary.



Medical Emergency or Illness: Children who are ill will not be able to participate in the program.

When must a student stay home?

- If he/she has had an oral temperature of 100 degrees or higher in the past 24 hours.
- If he/she has vomited in the past 24 hours
- If he/she has any rash for which the cause is unknown.

Parents are expected to pay their contracted fee whether or not their child is in attendance.
